"Timeline" Disclaimer – Please note that dates of construction are often mentioned in the news items below. It should be taken in account that these dates often change due to design changes, construction delays and other situations.

Ypsilanti Trail Segment Construction Starts

In mid-June, Ypsilanti City Council approved construction for a new B2B bridge across the Huron River from Riverside Park, a signaled Trail crossing of Michigan Avenue and a permanent pathway along the north shore of the Huron River from Michigan Avenue to Grove Road. While the City did receive major grants from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, the Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission, Downtown Development Authority, Eastern Michigan University and St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, the City Council weighed financial hardships and still committed its funds to the project, noting that the project will be a major plus for development in the immediate area and a real plus for recreation.

A groundbreaking was held on the project on August 20th, followed by construction starting a short amount of time later (for a news story with photos on the groundbreaking <u>click here</u>). On this construction, the first wave was starting work on the new Huron River bridge which will also be fully handicapped accessible. St. Joseph Mercy Hospital B2B Spur Improved Recently

Not widely know, but in existence, is a scenic B2B limestone/gravel base spur route through the woods to the north of St. Joseph Mercy Hospital that had fallen into disrepair. Recently, however, this spur received a new layer of limestone/gravel and was also rolled down firm, where wider-sized bike tires can travel over it with no problem. The route is also great for dog walking. The spur takes you off the main B2B and after going into the woods, takes you back to the main trail. To find the two spur junctions with the main B2B at St. Joes, look for the larger B2B signs that have maps on them (one is almost right across from the main hospital entrance and the other at the near the driveway going in to "The Sanctuary At St. Joes" assisted living facility) and these will show the spur trail clearly.

Membership Now Available In the Friends Of The B2B Trail

Dexter-Huron Metropark To Dexter Segment

The latest on this very short B2B unfinished segment that goes from the current west end of the Dexter-Huron Metropark path to Central Avenue in Dexter (about 2/10's of a mile), word is it should still be completed this year. The latest delay was Amtrak, which operates passenger train service adjacent to this link, insisting on extra safety procedures during path construction, such as having a flagman near the track.

New Connector Trail Group Formed - The Huron-Waterloo Pathways Initiative

A fairly new group has been formed with the long term goal of having a non-motorized path from Dexter west to Chelsea, then up to Stockbridge. This proposed trail would also join the B2B Trail at Dexter. For more information, including maps, visit http://huron-waterloo-pathways.org.

Volunteers Needed To "Adopt" Trail Segments

The Friends of the Border To Border Trail is still looking for volunteers who would be willing to "adopt" a section of the Border To Border Trail. Volunteers, who routinely use a specific B to B segment on a regular (2-4 times a month) basis would be asked to perform the following...

- Pick up trash (although for the most part, the B to B stays remarkably trash-free).
- Report serious problems (potholes, major downed branches, missing direction signs, etc.).
- During the "green" months, trim back (with hand-tools) vegetation tending to obstruct the trail.

Currently, B-to-B segments needing "adoption" would include (links are to maps of each segment)...

- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) Bridge Road west to Harris Road/Loonfeather Park
- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) Harris Road/Loonfeather Park west to Grove Road I-94 bridge
