Friends Of The B to B Annual Membership Meeting - November 17th

The Friends of the B2B Trail will hold its first annual general membership meeting on Tuesday, November 17th, 7pm at the Ann Arbor REI store community room, <u>970 W Eisenhower Parkway</u>. The meeting starts off with updates and speakers on the B2B Trail and ending with a short business session. You do <u>not</u> have to be Friends of the B2B member to attend this event.

The featured speaker at the annual meeting will be Peter Sanderson from the Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission (the main agency behind the Trail) giving news updates such as steps being taken to take the Trail off road from Dexter to Ann Arbor and also north into Livingston County. Also at the meeting, representatives of the Huron Waterloo Pathways group (http://huron-waterloo-pathways.org) will give an update on their work to create an off-road path from Dexter to Chelsea to Stockbridge.

Ypsilanti B2B Trail Segment Construction Update

As of early November, the new segment of the Border To Border Trail in Ypsilanti from Michigan Avenue south to Grove Road has been paved and is now open for use. In addition a new B2B Trail bridge from Riverside Park across the Huron River to Michigan Avenue was installed on November 5th with construction details set to be wrapped up by mid-November.

With cold weather shutting down construction for the winter, the spring of 2016 will see the installation of a signaled crossing of Michigan Avenue from the new bridge to the new paved B2B segment in the Water Street area. Also planned for 2016 will be improved non-motorized connections between the south end of the newly paved B2B segment at Grove Road south to the Grove Road /I-94 bridge.





Dexter-Huron Metropark To Dexter Segment

After many delays, construction on this very short segment from the current west end of the Dexter-Huron Metropark path to Central Avenue in Dexter (about 2/10's of a mile) has started and is scheduled to be completed by the end of December if not earlier.

B2B Pavement Directional Markings

The Friends of the Border To Border Trail and the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission are working together to have directional markings painted on sections of the Border To Border Trail that will have a "B2B" marking along with a directional arrow informing users to turn or go straight. These markings will be in addition to B2B directional signs already in place. Such directional symbols are commonly used on large bicycle ride events, such as the Ann Arbor Bicycle Touring Society "One Helluva Ride". A few of these markings will be put up in late 2015 so as to gather public input, with many more markings painted in the spring of 2016.

Dexter-Huron Metropark to Ann Arbor B2B Segment

The Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission is continuing to very actively work on a master plan for taking the B2B Trail off-road from Dexter-Huron Metropark east to Ann Arbor with key aspects at the present time being route selection and working with "stakeholders" (i.e. governmental bodies that would be involved in the total process). As the master plan for this segment becomes more definitive, public information and input sessions are planned.

Ann Arbor Gallup B2B Improvements

Still on track for 2016 is the repaying of the Trail from the Dixboro dam to the "wooden auto bridge" in the center of Gallup Park. As reported earlier delays on this paying was delayed due to easement legalities. This project will be largely funded through a Federal Transportation Alternatives grant (https://www.michigan.gov/documents/mdot/MDOT_TEA_Overview_175763_7.pdf)

Taking The B2B Trail North

Work is continuing on a steady basis to take the B2B Trail north from its present end at Hudson Mills Metropark to meet up with the Lakeland Trail (www.hamburg.mi.us/lakelands trail state park). Staff from the Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission are working closely with officials from the Huron-Clinton Metropark Authority, Livingston County and Hamburg Township on where the pathway will be located as well as obtaining funding for construction. It also should be noted that the Lakeland Trail will also be a part of the "Great Lake-to-Lake Trail" from South Haven to Port Huron.

Border To Border Trail AABTS Bike Ride

The Ann Arbor Bicycle Touring Society (www.aabts.org) every year holds a number of rides on the B2B with the final ride for 2015 being Sunday, November 15th at 10am. The ride will be on the B2B from Dexter to Hudson Mills Metropark, with optional longer rides off-trail on area roads. For more information contact Lynn at 734-546-1047. The ride starts at the Fire Station at Mill Creek Park (parking there too) in Dexter and is open to the public (you don't need to be an AABTS member to participate).

Huron-Waterloo Pathways Update

The Huron-Waterloo Pathways group, who's long term goal of having a non-motorized path from Dexter west to Chelsea, then up to Stockbridge, held a well attended open-house session on October 21st in Chelsea. The group also recently secured three separate \$25,000 private donations from Chelsea Milling, Chelsea State Bank and the Peter and Patti Feeney Family. With the help of these donations, Huron Waterloo Pathways is actively working to create a unique, looped trail connection to Michigan's Iron Belle Trail. The circular design of the trail ties the Border-2-Border Trail and the Lakelands State Trail into a single, integrated trail system. The resulting 44-mile trail, known as the "Loop," will create a unique and highly attractive destination for regional events entirely off of roadways. Volunteers Needed To "Adopt" Trail Segments

The Friends of the Border To Border Trail is still looking for volunteers who would be willing to "adopt" a section of the Border To Border Trail. Volunteers, who routinely use a specific B to B segment on a regular (2-4 times a month) basis would be asked to perform the following...

- Pick up trash (although for the most part, the B to B stays remarkably trash-free).
- Report serious problems (potholes, major downed branches, missing direction signs, etc.).
- During the "green" months, trim back (with hand-tools) vegetation tending to obstruct the trail.

Currently, B-to-B segments needing "adoption" would include (links are to maps of each segment)...

- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) Bridge Road west to Harris Road/Loonfeather Park
- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) <u>Harris Road/Loonfeather Park west to Grove Road I-94 bridge</u>
