"Timeline" Disclaimer – Please note that dates of construction are often mentioned in the news items below. It should be taken in account that these dates often change due to design changes, construction delays and other situations.

Ypsilanti Trail Segment

As of late February, a slight redesign was still being reviewed by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for this B-to-B segment just east of downtown. The project would involve a bridge from Riverside Park south to the eastern end of the Michigan Avenue bridge across the Huron River, as well as constructing a permanent (hard surface) trail along the north shore of the Huron River from Michigan Avenue south/southeast to Grove Road. The reason for the redesign is that when construction bids went out in 2014, the bids received turned out to higher that project funds available. Plans were then redrawn to allow for some cost savings but keep the project mostly intact.

Once the DNR approves the redesigned plans (which is expected soon), the bids will go out again for this project. Actual construction of these segments will now not take place any earlier than late spring 2015. For a basic map of the planned Ypsilanti segment, <u>click here</u>. At Michigan Avenue, there will be a HAWK signal is basically a stoplight for motorists to give non-motorized a way to cross a road. Winter Trail Maintenance

A basic goal of the Friends of the Border To Border Trail is to keep the Trail plowed and open from Ann Arbor to Ypsilanti. To this extent in the winter of 2014-15, the City of Ann Arbor and Eastern Michigan University both get an "A" for snow removal, but other sections are problematic but continue to be worked on by the Friends Of The Border To Border Trail. Ann Arbor Group Meets To Push For B to B Completion There

Larry Deck of the Washtenaw Bicycling & Walking Coalition (www.wbwc.org) met with a number of Ann Arbor individuals in February for a plan of action (click here to view this document which does include maps) to work to complete off-road Trail routings in the City. This group also attended the February Ann Arbor Parks Advisory Committee meeting to present this plan and will also attend the Committee's March meeting. Representatives from the Friends Of The Border To Border Trail will start becoming involved with this group and also lobby the City of Ann Arbor for Trail completion there

More B to B Feeder Trails

A growing number of feeder trails are being planned to tie in with the Border To Border Trail, with the following being two examples...

- Dixboro Shared Use Trail This trail is planned to start at Parker Mill County Park (on Geddes Road between Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti) and go north into the University of Michigan Mathaei Botanical Gardens. Future plans are for the Dixboro Trail to extend all the way north to Plymouth Road. This project is being overseen by Ann Arbor Township and the Friends of the Border To Border Trail has sent a support letter to the Township to aid in obtaining development grants. - Allen Creek Greenway This path would run along the largely submerged (i.e. drain pipes underground) Allen Creek watershed, just to the west of downtown Ann Arbor (<u>for a map click here</u>). 2nd Annual BtoB West River Trail Fun Run & Walk

The Washtenaw County Parks & Recreation Commission is sponsoring the 2nd annual West River Trail Fun Run & Walk on Saturday, May 2nd at Hudson Mills Metropark just north of Dexter. The event will start at 9am will have a fun run & walk along with a 10k timed run. Runs start at 9am and will start from the north entrance to Hudson Mills Metropark along Territorial Road. Registration can be done on the day of the event (registration starts at 7:30am) or can be done online at WebTrac Activity Search.

Volunteers Needed To "Adopt" Trail Segments

The Friends of the Border To Border Trail is still looking for volunteers who would be willing to "adopt" a section of the Border To Border Trail. Volunteers, who routinely use a specific B to B segment on a regular (2-4 times a month) basis would be asked to perform the following...

- Pick up trash (although for the most part, the B to B stays remarkably trash-free).
- Report serious problems (potholes, major downed branches, missing direction signs, etc.).
- During the "green" months, trim back (with hand-tools) vegetation tending to obstruct the trail.

Currently, B-to-B segments needing "adoption" would include (links are to maps of each segment)...

- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) Bridge Road west to Harris Road/Loonfeather Park
- Grove Road (Ypsilanti Township) Harris Road/Loonfeather Park west to Grove Road I-94 bridge
- St. Joseph Mercy Hospital/Washtenaw Community College area
- Ann Arbor Corner of Fuller Road/Maiden Lane west to Whitmore Lake Road (just beyond M14 bridge)
- Dexter Dexter-Huron Metropark
